

45 minutes of fun!!








#### **JOEY's JOTTINGS**


Sam made a film of where he lives and what he does on his property, it was great to see, and Sam was able to demonstrate his bike riding skills.

#### Mt Remarkable Hike

**Belinda** and **Alex** went on a significant adventure in the southern Flinders Ranges. Some unexpected weather meant it did not quite go to plan.

Here's Belinda's report on the hike:

As a requirement in both the Adventurer level Campcraft and OAS level 5, Alex and I had to plan and go on a 3 day, 2 night hike. The planning part included a map, route plan, emergency plan, menu, equipment list and risk management document. We decided to do it in Mt. Remarkable starting at Mambray Creek Campground and finishing at Alligator Lodge via Hidden Camp and Sugar Gum Dam Camp.

The weather was extremely wet with it raining heavily almost all of the first day. This caused Hidden Gorge to be flooded and we couldn't get through to the campgrounds. *Alex, Ethan* (a scout from Port Augusta) and *I* camped near a water tank near the start of the Gorge and had dinner cooked on a Trangia after setting up the tents.

The next day after cleaning up and re-packing our packs we went back the way we came then met our parents at the Mambray Creek Campgrounds, where we started after making the decision to cancel the remainder of the hike due to sore muscles, a blocked track as well as a lot of mud.

Several times we almost slipped due to the mud (which would have resulted in bad injuries due to being on the edge of a very steep hill), but we managed to get there in the end with nothing more then a splinter from a prickle bush.

In the end, it is an experience I won't forget in a long time.









Sam fishing from a houseboat
