VENTURER VIBRATIONS



Hi everyone,

Since the last update, Venturers have been somewhat, kinda, probably, sort of busy.

Easter Venture (EV).

EV is a 4-day competitive hike for Venturers, older Scouts & Guides.

EV is a team event, and they hike in teams of four to seven.

This year, EV started on Good Friday and ended on Easter Monday with the hiking undertaken in the Barossa Goldfields, Para Wirra, and Kersbrook Forest areas.

This year the EV theme was "Spaced Out" - everything and anything related to space, aliens, science fiction.

Lone Venturers fielded two teams this year.

The Lone Venturer Team "SPACE COWBOYS" was a day pack team and consisted of 4 Lone Venturers (*Ceobahn* Webber-Wilson, *Benjamin* Faehrmann, *Jayden* Howe & *Brodie* Gaskin) and 3 *Morialta* Venturers.

Due to an allergy condition of a Lone Venturer, all the other members of the team did very well to help minimise the allergy exposure and this Lone Venturer ended up thoroughly enjoying EV. The team also did a massive well-being effort in welcoming another Venturer as their 8th team member on Sunday (she had difficulty in another team) and turning her negativity around and she started to enjoy EV again. Their teamwork and humility were not only awesome, but this was noticed and positively commented by the EV Admin Team. **BRAVO!**

The other Lone Venturer Team "ORION'S BELT" consisted of 4 Lone Venturers (*Benjamin* Forg, *David* Forg, *Jack* McKenzie & *Lachlan* Stokes) and 3 *Tassie* Venturers (*Nicholas* Yam, *Connor* Thomson & *Brayden* Sykes). Yes, from Tasmania!

We were told this was the first time EV had interstate Venturers.

Right from registration, the EV Coordinator had commented that they gel very well together and were a team to watch. Well indeed so.

Orion's Belt won EV and picked up 4 trophies, the most of any team this year.

The top trophy being (1) the EV Trophy, which is the top score from all activities, (2) the Hike Trophy for the top full pack team reaching the most checkpoints, (3) the Theme Trophy for the best team representing the theme Spaced Out, and (4) the Pick Trophy for being the team that best embodies the Scouting spirit and values, and this was scored by all Leaders and Adults. They also won the annual Duck Challenge, acquiring 49 plastic ducks hidden in the bush at night. It was a sight to see Venturers in a mad scramble in the dark hunting for toy ducks! *Totally quackers*!

The other thing that happened at EV this year was the two new Lone Venturer Leaders, China Mug (Venturer Leader) and Koala (Assistant Venturer Leader) showed up. China brought the Tassie Venturers with him, and he also helped as part of the EV First Aid Team.

Words from China Mug:

"Although Lone Scouting is not a new concept, it does however have challenges that a "normal" Scout Group does not have, namely the regular face-to-face contact and the ability to practice working in patrols and teams. So, it was great to see both Space Cowboys and Orion's Belt were not only able to work well amongst themselves, but also with Venturers from other Units and from across Bass Straits. They all deserve acknowledgement, recognition, and great BIG pats on their shoulders till they are worn out. As their Leader, I am humbled and proud of the teamwork, care, consideration, decency, and humanity demonstrated by the Lone Venturers".

After EV, the *Tassie Venturers* visited MegaAdventure (a huge ropes course), Monarto Safari Zoo, Hahndorf (a German village), had 15-inch pizzas one night and Korean BBQ dinner another night, and to their Scouting credit, teamed up with Blackwood Cubs and helped build an obstacle course (they were staying at the Blackwood Scout Group Hall). Big thanks to *Nicola* Capon for being their Tour Guide.

ANZAC Services

A number of Lone Venturers attended ANZAC Services, including *Brodie* Gaskin who manned the flagpole at both the Dawn and Main services at the Roxby Downs cenotaph. *China Mug* organised and coordinated the ANZAC Eve Youth Vigil at the Launceston Cenotaph where a total of 78 Joeys, Cubs, Scouts, Venturers and Rovers guarded the cenotaph in shifts from 6:00 pm on ANZAC Day eve to the start of the Dawn Service.

Queen's Scout Hike

The last school holidays also saw *Frog* (Ceobahn) organised a 4-day hike in the Murray River National Park for her and 4 other Lone Venturers. The hike was well-planned with food drops and all went well.

Unleashed

Scouts SA hosted a Youth Forum called UNLEASH on Saturday 17 April for young people in order to discuss what specific challenges are currently affecting them. A series of initiatives will be developed following the outcomes of the forum. These initiatives will be designed to build early resilience and empower young people to have a positive impact on the challenges they face. This was held at the Nunyara Conference Centre, in conjunction with the Commissioner for Children and Young People.

Each Scout Group was allocated a section and for a youth from that section to represent that Group. Lones was allocated Venturers and our rep was *Brodie* Gaskin. Despite the long drive from Roxby Downs, Brodie enjoyed the experience, and this was his report:

"I participated in Unleashed 2021. I was in the Pink Patrol. Unleashed had participants from all sections, from all over SA. Each Patrol had a rep from each Youth section. First, we came up with ideas for a new camp, and each Patrol presented their ideas to the rest. Pink Patrol came up with a 24-hour raft challenge. Other ideas included a 7-day treehouse challenge, a camp based on cheese and a hike around Woodhouse.

The Commissioner of Youth of SA came and ran some activities, including what irritates us, what we see us doing when we are 25, and create in pasta and blu-tack the future in Scouting. We also made an Instagram advertisement for Scouting in SA. We were asked about our knowledge on the New Program, Terrain, Scouting positions and Peak Awards. I enjoyed Unleashed 2021, and there were even a few Rovers from EV". Well done Brodie.

Snow Venture

After last year's cancellation due to Covid, the annual Snow Venture for Venturers is on again this year from 9 to 18 July and at Falls Creek in Victoria at the Rover Chalet. We have 4 Lone Venturers (*Benjamin* Forg, *David* Forg, *Travis* Ind and *Ceobahn* Webber-Wilson) heading there and we look forward to their reports when they get back with some melted snow souvenirs.

New Assistant Venturer Leader

We welcome *Cherie Gaskin*, aka *Koala*, as one of our two Assistant Venturer Leaders. *Koala* hails from Roxby Downs and has a Lone Venturer son. She's also the Joey Leader at Roxby Downs and has been involved with that Scout Group for some 10 years. Her love for Guiding/Scouting began as a Brownie and Girl Guide in Adelaide, and eventually became a Guide Leader but later switched to Scouting.
