Raksha's scouting career commenced in the United Kingdom before moving to Australia and joining South Australian Scouts in 1967, commencing with the Warradale Scout Group in May 1967, (there are several past & present Lones with origins to Warradale Scout Group), before moving to Fulham Sea Scouts (70-84), Lockleys SG (84-88), back to Fulham Sea Scouts (88-90) and then to Lones in February 1993.

Raksha was made a Life Member of Scouts in 1996 and was awarded the prestigious scouting award the "Silver Emu" in 2005.

We have had the honour of Raksha being part of lives, the influence and knowledge Raksha has provided our Lones Youth Members and Leaders, will always be a part of who and what Lones are today, *Raksha* you'll always be forever in our hearts.

You will be missed at Annual Camp and often course in the Kitchen!

June Camp at Napperby is just around the corner, looking forwards to see as many of you that can make it there.

Well that's about me for this Lone Trail, yep short and shining this one.





Joey Scouts are going to try and get our *Jamboree on the Trail* badges by going for a hike, which is one of the things the girls have both chosen.





Did you know? Today Scouts Australia has 52,000 Youth members.

In 1990 our Youth membership was 93,000.

In 1979 our Youth membership was 114,500 - and this was before the introduction of girls in the younger sections, Cubs & Scouts in 1988, and the introduction of Joey Scouts in 1990.

In 1979 our Total Membership was 166,000.

Today, the population of Australia is 23 million, in 1979 it was 14 million.

Currently UK Scouting has a waiting list of 37,000 young people hoping to join Scouting.

Scouting in Ireland, New Zealand and Canada are reviewing or have recently reviewed their youth program.

In 2012 we recruited 19,105 Youth members but we lost 18,858 Youth members.
