AWARD SCHEME

WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

AWARD SCHEME

- (5) a History Night where each Venturer made a presentation of the history of their local areas; and
- (6) a 5-minute challenges night, with many interesting and lateral thinking results.

EASTER VENTURE

This is a SA annual 4-day hiking competition for Venturers held every Easter.

There are two sections – Day-Pack Teams where Venturers hike during the day with day-packs while their main luggage gets transported between nightly campgrounds, and Full-Pack Teams where Venturers hike everywhere with their backpacks.

This year’s Easter Venture was held at the Mt Crawford State Forest from Friday 15th to Monday 19th April 2022. It started with registration on Good Friday at 7:30 am. Imagine the dedication of Venturers getting up so early on a public holiday and head off to 4 days of hiking!

Thanks to Blackwood Park Scout Group for letting us use their Scout Hall as an overnight stay the night before EV started. We had 4 Venturers who stayed overnight. The pizza dinner at the local Montagna Café was awesome.

This year, we fielded a Lones Day-Pack Team, called the “*Jumanji*” Team as the competition theme was “Welcome to the Jungle”. The team consisted of *Brodie Gaskin* (Team Leader), *Jayden Howe*, *Ashley Miles*, *Anise Piltz*, *Benjamin Faehrmann* with *Tyson Gibson* (Lone Scout) and *Colby Ind* (Mt Gambier Scout). On Sunday, both *Brodie* and *Jayden* had to pull out due to injuries. Although they were not significant injuries, it would have affected their ability to continue with the event. The rest of the Team did admirably.

And by all accounts and from Leader and Rover observers, the whole team did very well working together. **BRAVO!**

We also fielded a Lones Full-Pack Team called “*Panda Poachers*”. The team consisted of *Benjamin Forg*, *David Forg*, *Jack McKenzie*, *Lachlan Stokes* (all Lone Venturers) plus *Brayden Sykes* and *Connor Thomson* from 4th Launceston Venturer Unit in Tasmania and *Ayden Mesecke* from Hallett Cove Venturer Unit.

Both Lones teams combined their resources to win the annual Duck Challenge on the Saturday night, acquiring 64 plastic ducks hidden in the bush at night. It was a sight to see Venturers in a mad scramble in the dark hunting for plastic toy ducks! Totally quackers!

At the presentation ceremony on Monday morning, the *Lones Day-Pack Jumanji Team* was awarded a Silver certificate.

The *Lones Full-Pack Panda Poachers Team* won: (1) the Graham Shield Perpetual Trophy, which is awarded to the overall best team, with the highest score from all activities; and (2) the Hike Trophy for the top full pack team reaching the most checkpoints.

Lone Venturers have now won these two trophies back-to-back, after winning them last year. With the exception of *Ayden*, the rest of the team were the same team members as last year’s winning team.
