Andre Freund has kindly taken on this role, which I am so very thankful for.


I will remain as Assistant Group Leader so that I can carry out administrative duties in a more thorough manner.

Sam and Max to our Cub Troop.





SCOUT NEWS

We currently have 9 Scouts, with some away and some a little zoom-shy.

In addition to the 3 Renmark Scouts joining us last term while they seek a new Scout Leader, we now have Moonta Scouts joining us in Term 3 who are in the same boat.

WELCOME Moonta Scouts. We hope you enjoy Lone Scouts and become active participants.

WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

Since the last edition of the Lone Trail, our weekly Tuesday night activities continued in Term 2 and have included:

- (1) 5 Minute Challenges, where Scouts worked out solutions to a series of challenges. These included
- (a) Highest Tower Using only stationery, build the tallest tower you can manage;
- (b) Smiling Bread Decorate the best smile you can manage on a slice of bread;
- (c) Cookie challenge Balance a cookie on your forehead and then you have a minute to get the cookie into your mouth without using your hands (or dropping it!);
- (d) Blind Artist Blindfold yourself. Draw these things in order:
- (i) There's a one-storey house with a door, two windows and a chimney;
- (ii) The sun is shining and there are two clouds in the sky;
- (iii) There is a big tree in the garden and a bird sitting in a nest in the tree;
- (iv) There is a dog watching the bird;
- (v) Somebody is waving from a window.

Unfold blindfold and show what you have drawn.

And, (2) Scouts MasterChef – where Scouts cooked a meal using Baked Beans as the main ingredient.

There were some great dishes like enchiladas and puff rolls.

In Term 3, our program theme was "Chaos". Our chaotic program has included:

- (1) A guest speaker from the Sydney company Chaos Theory Games. Thanks to Nico King, a co-founder of the company for speaking to and really engaging our Scouts. With two best friends and all at the age of 12, they founded their company and has since developed many mobile games, including many that have cultural and conservation values.
- (2) A Shark Night, where we learnt and admire the chaotic life of sharks. Some shark facts: Sharks Sharks do not have bones, their skin is like sandpaper, they have 300 triangular teeth, they are not anchored in jaws, loose teeth when feeding and they have 30,000 teeth in one lifetime.
- (3) We tried to watch a 2008 American comedy movie called "Chaos Theory" where efficiency expert Frank Allen (Ryan Reynolds) has always lived in step with a well-planned series of lists and timetables. His wife (Emily Mortimer) decides to play a joke on him and sets his clock back 10 minutes, but the consequences are far greater than expected. However, the movie was a fizzle.
- (4) Chaotic Art, where we spoke about what makes art chaotic, had a look at chaotic art over the last century and Scouts then drew and presented their chaotic art.
- (5) Chaotic Debate. We watched some of the more recent chaotic debates, between Trump and Biden, and between Morrison and Albanese, looked at what one-minute debates are, and then Scouts participated in one-minute debates. Topics included: Pie or Cake, Summer or Winter, Cat or Dog, Wired or Wireless headphones and is soup a good food. It was an interesting night.
- And, (6) Chaotic Cooking, where we watched a video of some people who did not really know how to cook, and then Scouts proceeded to cook a dish which had no recipe and no measurements. There were some really good dishes, including a stir-fry. The chaos continues in Term 3.



VINNIES WINTER SLEEPOUT

Scouts participated in the 2022 Vinnies Community Winter Sleepout where Scouts slept rough to gain an understanding of homelessness. Sleeping rough during our activity could be in the backyard, car, garage, tent, swag, rumpus room, couch-surfing or sleeping on the floor at home or at family members'. We were very fortunate to have a Vinnies Youth and Community Engagement Officer join us that night and spoke to us about homelessness in SA with facts and figures. The guest speaker happened to be an ex-Scout from Nepal. We also watch an episode from the SBS TV series "Filthy Rich and Homeless" and ended the activity with a reflection on homelessness by everyone the next morning.



AWARD SCHEME




WEEKLY ACTIVITIES


Lone Venturers have continued to be a busy and active bunch.


What is NONT?

Night Observation and Navigation Trial, NONT, is an annual themed event run by South Australian Rovers in which teams travel in vehicles to complete a night navigation trial. Each Team is allocated a Starting Point and often travel a route up to 300 kms through the metro and Adelaide Hills. Each Team needs to decipher & solve a range of puzzles in order to obtain the correct route to each Checkpoint. On route, points can be obtained by identifying and recording Navigational Markers or Observations. At each Checkpoint, Teams have the opportunity to have some fun and compete for points by completing the themed activities. Driving throughout the night, Teams need to keep an eye out for the observations to make sure they are on the right track.

As NONT consists of lots of driving, Teams require confident and safe drivers.

We encourage and support safe driving through managing fatigue, using appropriately skilled and prepared drivers, and taking frequent breaks.
