SCOUT NEWS

With Lone Scouts helping other Groups who currently don't have Scout Leaders, we now have Renmark and Moonta Scouts joining in our weekly Zoom sessions. It's always great to have a variety of Scouts from different locations. Adds to the richness of Scouting. Hope you all enjoy our Lone Scout program until your Group finds you a new Scout Leader. We also have some Scouts from Barmera and Roxby Downs zooming in as well. You are all welcomed at all Lone activities, including our awesome annual Group Camp at Woodhouse.

We also bid farewell to *Tyson Gibson*, who was invested into Lone Venturers at our 2022 Annual Lones Group Camp. It was great having you at Lone Scouts and we all wish you the best in enjoying your time with Lone Venturers.

WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

Since the last edition of the Lone Trail, our weekly Tuesday night activities continued in Term 3 with the theme of Chaos:

- (1) "Chaotic Games", where we played several chaotic games including a Mission Impossible scavenger hunt;
- (2) "Chaotic Simon Says", and yes there were some crazy chaotic moves by some Scouts trying not to get caught;
- (3) "Chaotic Pioneering", where Scouts had to (a) create their ideal camp gadget using Lego, toothpicks, cards, paddle-pop sticks, straws, paper, cardboard, etc. and (b) design their next Unit campsite will look like. It was quite a hilarious night.

During the camp, it was great to see Scouts not only participating in activities but took the initiative to help Cubs and Joeys with several activities.




With regards to the Award Scheme, many milestones, SIAs (Special Interest Areas) and OAS (Outdoor Adventure Skills) were achieved.




