

During the School Holidays, Scouts attended ANZAC Day Services across the state.

Scouts so far during Term 2:

• Had a night where they discussed their favourite songs and what they meant to them. The songs were as varied as the interests of our Scouts.



• An SES night where we had a guest speaker from SES talk to us about what the SES undertook during the Riverland floods. We heard about the enormous sandbagging effort undertaken in the Riverland to prepare for the floods and how else they prepared for them.

What the SES do in general all over South Australia in rural and metropolitan areas in storms, car crashes in rural areas, fallen trees etc.

We learnt about the 3 different call-out Categories of the SES, how they work in an Emergency, and what exactly they do when they receive a phone call.

He also specifically spoke about what each Scout could do in their area regarding flooding if it occurs.

Numerous Scouts have earned their SES Badge: *Maddi*, *Addy*, *Hendrik*, *Matthew* and *Brock*.

• We had a night where we covered the basic OAS Bushcraft 'I Statements' from levels 1 to 3.

Scouts will have the opportunity to make fake wounds to go with First Aid practice on the night, various Sustainable Development Goals working towards the Better World Framework and pioneering to go this term.

Some of our Scouts are attending a Pioneering camp later in June at Roonka.
