Report from the Group Leader

Another twelve months has passed and we still have COVID-19 to contend with. We re-commenced from Term 3 2020 and had another lockdown recently in July causing us to miss a couple of weeks of face-to-face Scouting

The Leaders and I are looking forward to a busy few months before the end of year. We currently have 57 youth members and 9 Leaders at Magill. However, our Joey Unit needs another Leader to assist Rhys (Emu). Although the Joey numbers are small, it is still difficult for one Leader to organise and run the program. General

We enjoyed a **Group Camp at Roonka** (near Blanchetown) in March 2021. Over 75 youth members and families participated – the camp theme was Australiana. Lots of activities were held: canoeing, flying fox, swimming, fishing, water slide and more. The camp was a great success and we are looking to book a campsite for our 2022 camp, possibly in June/July.

This year we were able to participate in the **ANZAC celebrations** at The Gums Reserve. The Joeys, Cubs and Scouts slept-over at the hall. Hawkeye visited to help the young ones with the making of wreaths and posies. The youth members and Leaders left very early in the morning to walk to Shakespeare Avenue. At the conclusion of the ceremony everyone walked back to the hall to enjoy a hot breakfast of sausages, bacon and eggs.

Tree Planting Day was re-scheduled to 8 August because of COVID restrictions – there were 19 youth members and 6 Leaders/parents attending at Thorndon Park. Over 1000 trees were planted by all the volunteers (including Magill Scout Group) and completed in less than two hours. A job well done – thank you all.

I wish to acknowledge the **Parent Committee**: Thank you all for giving your time to support the group and to ensure the hall is kept in good condition, the accounts are paid, and equipment (tents, etc) purchased for the youth members to use.

Sincere thanks to all current **Leaders** for your efforts – Rhys, Rod, Bianca, David, Karen, Monique and Mike. Welcome to our new Assistant Cub Scout Leader – James Hyder (Bagheera). He is a great asset to the team on Tuesday nights.

Council has also finally budgeted for the cost of replacing our very outdated kitchen, assisted by funds from a Federal Government Grant called 'Stronger Communities'.

Over the past 12 months the Leaders of each section have once again come up with great programs to benefit our youth members and I thank them on behalf of the whole group of us for their continued efforts. Assistant Leaders and parent helpers are always required, particularly in the Joey Section at present, so please do not feel shy about offering to assist in any way – every little bit helps to lighten the load on our existing volunteers.

Treasurer's Report

Year ended 31 December 2020

The 1st Magill Scout Group financial records for the calendar year 2020 have been audited and submitted to Scouts SA.

The closing balance at the end of December 2020 was \$11,995.02 which represented a loss for the year of \$2,289.48. This is not surprising due to Covid-19 restrictions, terms 1 and 2 membership fees were waived and the group not being able to run their normal fundraising BBQs and the People's Choice Lottery was received in 2021.

The main expenses during 2020 is the general running of the group, such as HQ Insurance, utilities, cleaning and upgrading the books for the new program was \$5,493 (or 20% of total expenses).

All 2020 memberships have been paid, with a small amount of memberships which are on a payment plan. There were also six members that joined in term 4 which helped with the income. The summary of 2020 income and expenses is on the following page.

New year 2021

Our current bank balance is \$17,666.04. Our account has grown in 2021 due to majority of members paying in full at the start of the calendar.

The People's Choice Credit Union Community Lottery this year raised \$1098, and thank you to each of you who contributed, as 100% of money spent on buying theses tickets comes straight back to our group.
