Behaviour Guidelines

Unit Code of Conduct	
Be Respectful I will: <i>Consider the feelings of others. Respect people's personal space. Listen to others and wait my turn to speak. Raise my hand when I want to speak. Treat others honestly and fairly.</i>	Give Everything A Go I will: <i>Challenge myself to try something new. Be courageous. Learn from my experiences. Try something again if things don't go to plan.</i>
Be Kind and Help Others I will: <i>Be friendly and get to know other people. Be inclusive and celebrate our differences. Welcome new members into the Cub Unit.</i>	Follow Instructions I will: <i>Listen carefully to others. Stay safe at Cubs by following instructions. Make an effort to stay focused and on-task.</i>

This code of conduct is reviewed annually by the Cub Scout Unit Council. Last reviewed April 2023.

Consequences:

Any breaches of the Code of Conduct will be dealt with as follows.

1. Warning

The youth member is given a warning. In the warning it will be made clear which section of the Code of Conduct they have not followed.

2. Time Out

The youth member is sat out. When they are sitting quietly a Leader will talk to them about their behaviour, detailing which area of the Code of Conduct they have not followed and then next steps if they continue their poor behaviour.

3. Parent / Caregiver Called

The youth member will be asked to leave the weekly meeting. The youth members parent / caregiver will be called to collect them.

4. Follow Up

The following week the youth member will be able to return to Scouting. They youth members parent / caregiver will be required to attend the activity with them however.

Note: If a parent / caregiver has attended more than 8 times in this manner they will be requested to complete a Working With Childrens Check (WWCC).
