Trail Jam

On the second Saturday in May each year Scouts all around the world hike together. This year the Joeys, Cubs and Scouts will be combining for a hike in Belair National Park.

Choose Your Own Adventure: There are three hiking options for Trail Jam. Please choose the option which is most suitable for your hiking ability.

Hike Option One:

This walk is for youth members with minimal hiking experience – it is an easy walk on level ground. It is ideal for youth members working on OAS Bushwalking Stage One.

Time: 10:30 am to 12:00 pm Saturday 11th May

Drop Off / Pick Up Location: Main Oval
Belair National Park
Queens Jubilee Drive, Belair

Hike Information: Trail = Lorikeet Loop Walk
Distance = 3 km
Trail Class = Grade 1 (Easy Walk)

Hike Option Two:

This walk is for youth members who are ready to extend themselves past an hour long walk – it is a more challenging walk with up and down hill sections.

Time: 12:00 pm to 5:30 pm Saturday 11th May

Drop Off / Pick Up Location: Main Oval
Belair National Park
Queens Jubilee Drive, Belair

Hike Information: Trail = Waterfall Hike + Microcarpa Hike
Distance = 11 km
Trail Class = Grade 3 (Moderate Hike)

Hike Option Three:

This walk is for youth members who have previously (or are ready to) completed longer walks – it is a more challenging walk with up and down hill sections and will require greater endurance due to the seven hour event time. It is ideal for youth members working on OAS Bushwalking Stage Three and higher. (Note: A six hour bushwalking is required to be completed for OAS Stage Three.)

Time: 10:30 am to 5:30 pm Saturday 11th May

Drop Off / Pick Up Location: Main Oval
Belair National Park
Queens Jubilee Drive, Belair

Hike Information: Tail = Lorikeet Loop Walk + Waterfall Hike + Microcarpa Hike
Distance = 14 km
Trail Class = Grade 3 (Moderate Hike)

Extra Information:

Parking: It can be difficult to find carpark at the entrance to Belair National Park. Extra carparking is available on the residential streets outside the Park entrance or on the old golf club site.

GoogleMaps indicates the Belair National Park is a 20 minute drive from the Reynella Scout Hall.

The Scout Group will not be arranging transport to / from the Park, please meet us there.

Wear / Bring: Shirt and Neckie/Scarf
Broad Brim Hat (Caps are not acceptable)
Enclosed walking shoes
Backpack
Drink Bottle
Suncream
Insect Repellent
Raincoat
Lunch and Snacks (No nuts)

Note – It is best practice not to wear brand new shoes on a hike. Brand new shoes can often be unmalleable and may cause blisters.

Additional Information: Parents/Caregivers are welcome to join us on this hike. Siblings are able to join also provided they are accompanied by a parent/caregiver.

There are toilets scattered around the National Park. However at some part of the walk we will be over 30 minutes away from a toilet.

About TrailJam: A global Scout hike on the second Saturday in May started in Canada in 1997 before spreading to the UK and then to the rest of the world.

This year the event has been re branded TrailJam – it was previously called Jamboree On The Trail (JOTT).

All participants will receive the 2024 TrailJam Blanket Badge (pictured).
